Quaker Settlement Cemetery is located in Wyoming County on Quakertown Road in the Village of Warsaw in the Town of Orangeville, NY. Set on the edge of farmland, the cemetery is just over an acre in size with approximately 320 graves.

The cemetery itself was once farmland before it was incorporated as a cemetery in 1904. Prior to that, it was used by the Quakers in the area, with the earliest recorded grave in 1816. In 1827, the land was deeded to the Society of Friends (Quakers) of Hamburg, NY. The cemetery has generally been a family cemetery, merging with the Forest Lawn Cemtery Group in 2023. There are approximately 20 U.S. military veterans interred in Quaker Settlement Cemetery, including those who served during the Civil War, World War I, World War II, Korea and Vietnam.

In addition to recognizing the important history of our cemetery, and the early settlers buried here, we are an active cemetery today, with affordable options for casketed and cremation burial. As part of the Forest Lawn Cemetery Group, we pledge continued maintenance and care for the cemetery's grounds, committed to assuring its future.
